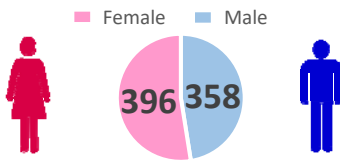
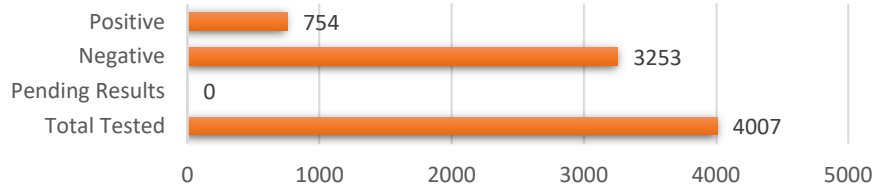

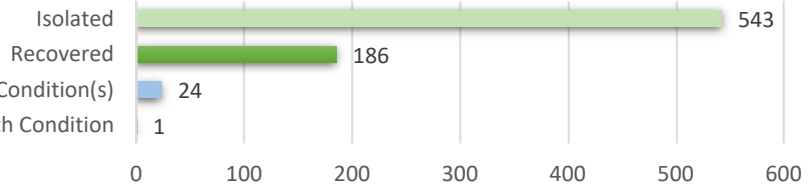

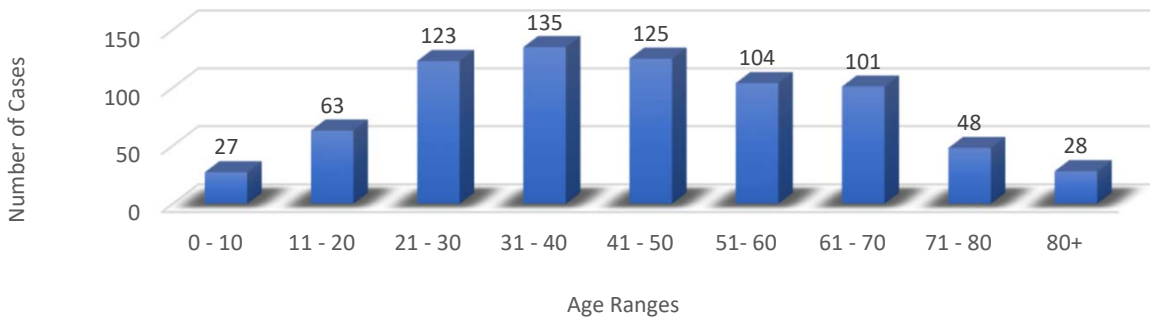
Status* of COVID-Test



Status of Confirmed Cases



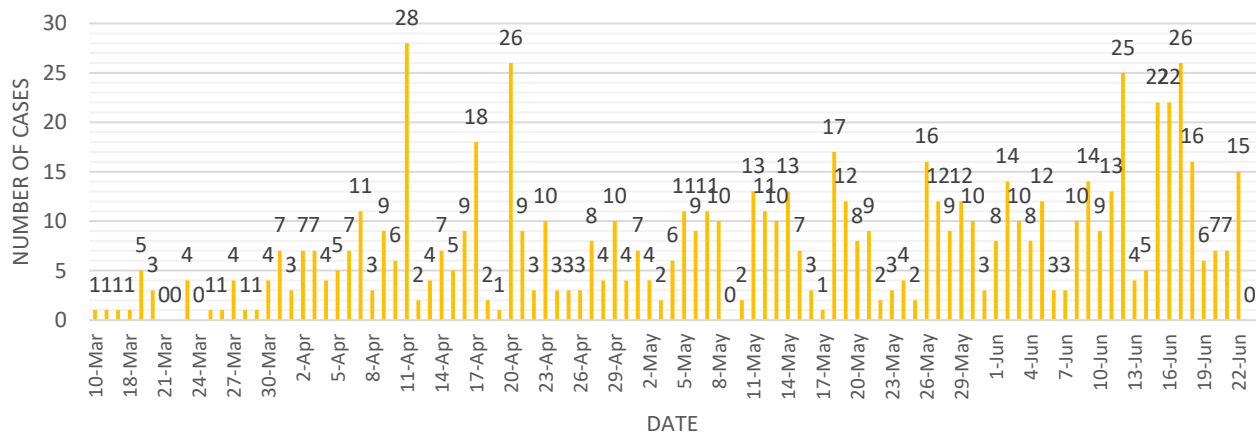
Confirmed Cases by Age Range

A message from Mayor Becky Ames, June 23, 2020:

- The National Guard Mobile Testing Team tested 210 people at the Sterling Pruitt Activity Center yesterday.
- We have had many questions about the “Pending Results” section of our data. This section is only updated in this report when Beaumont Public Health receives demographic information of the individuals tested from the testing providers prior to having the test results. This information is not always immediately available as most providers only send us the bulk of the demographic information once they receive test results. In situations where the City operates the collection sites, we are able to obtain the demographic information and our data is updated to reflect it immediately.
- As the State of Texas opens back up, safety protocols have been established to minimize spread. If they are followed, they will reduce the spread. They include: (1) at-risk persons should stay home; (2) hands should be frequently sanitized; (3) persons should maintain safe distances from others if they must go out; and (4) if people do go out, they should wear a mask.
