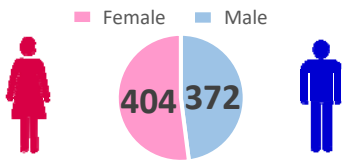
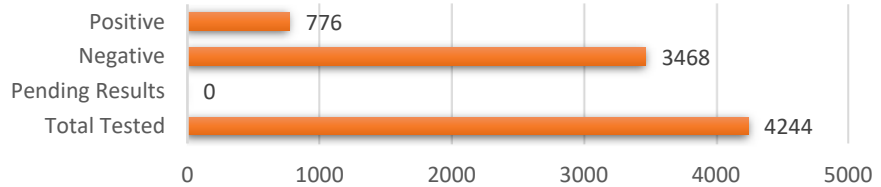

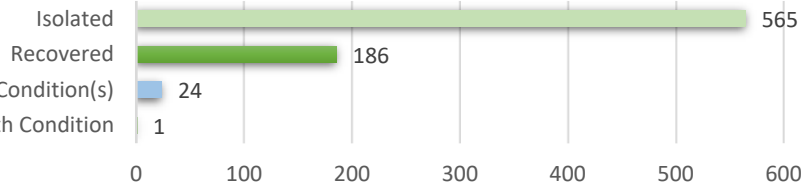

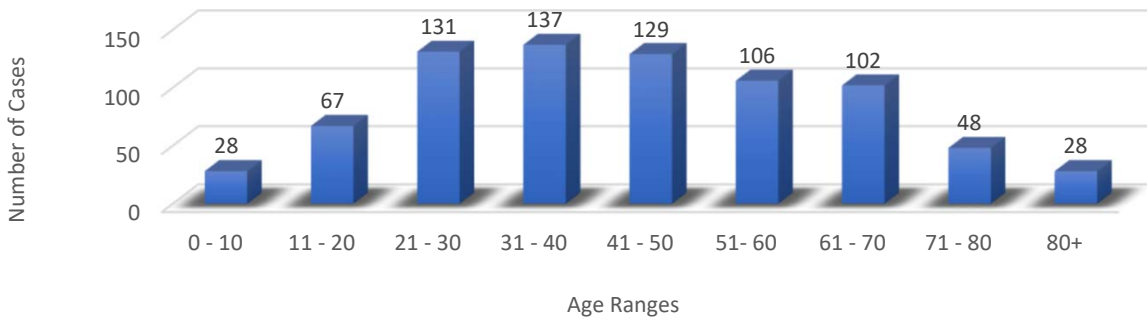
Status* of COVID-Test



Status of Confirmed Cases



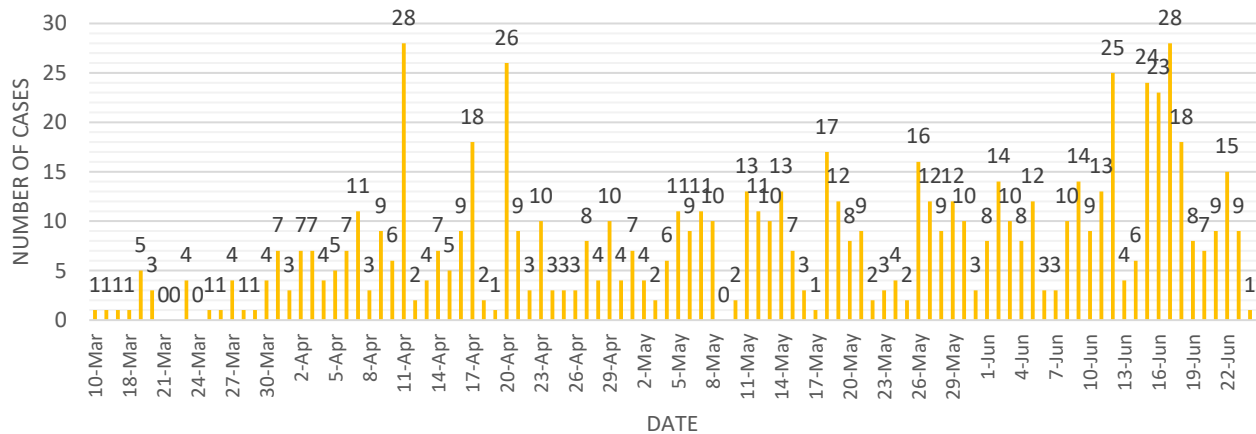
Confirmed Cases by Age Range

Updates to the data are made daily by 4:00 PM.

A message from Mayor Becky Ames, June 24, 2020:

- Please know that our data is only as good as what is reported. Multiple locations in the Beaumont jurisdiction are now doing Covid-19 testing...community clinics, hospitals, urgent and non-urgent care centers, physicians' offices and many planned community events for testing. By law, all are required to report any positive infectious diseases to the Public Health Authority. If they do not report, we have no way of knowing. In addition, these same organizations are not required to report any Covid-19 tests that come back negative, however; many do and all of the planned community events report both negative and positive. Therefore, our negative results are only reflective of what is reported. Positive results should be conclusive unless the organization fails to report it to the Public Health Authority.
- We have also received messages that you would like to see total tested on a daily basis. Total tested is also reflective of the statement I wrote about negatives above. Many organizations are testing but they do not have to report the number of tests performed.
- On June 25 the National Guard Mobile Testing Team will conduct mobile testing at the Sterling Pruitt Center at 2930 Gulf Street from 9am to 4pm. Testing is free, no registration is required. Please bring identification.
