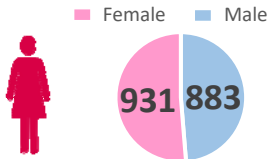
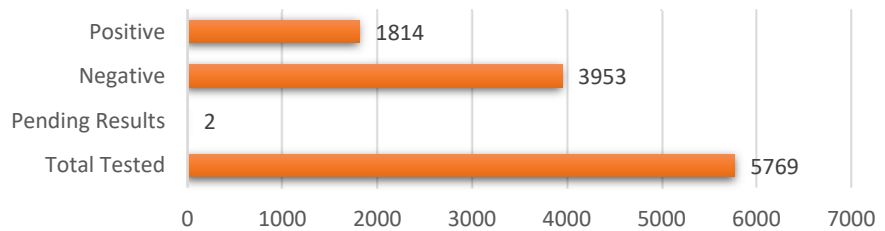

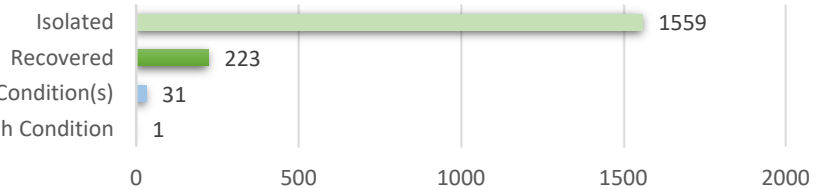

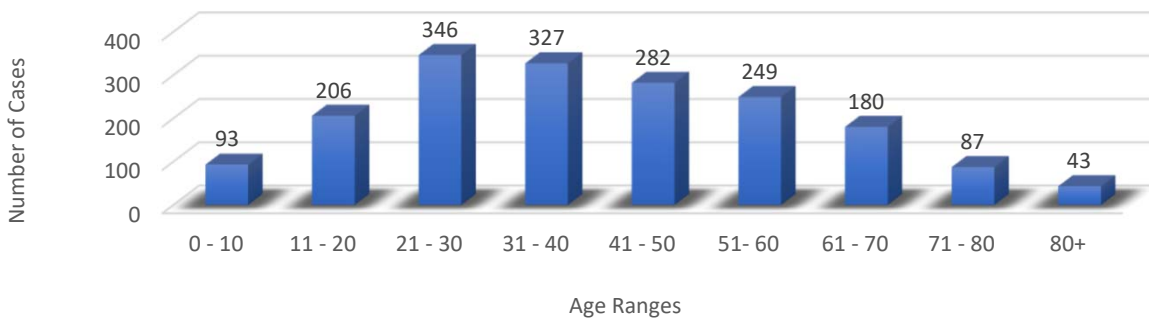
Status* of COVID-Test



Status of Confirmed Cases



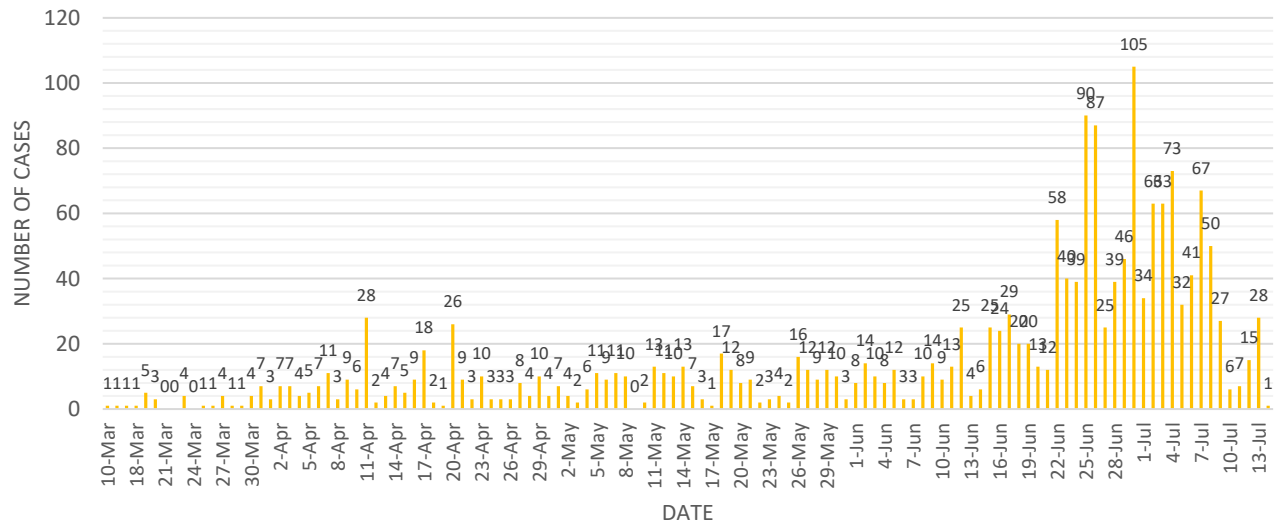
Confirmed Cases by Age Range

A message from Mayor Becky Ames, July 14, 2020:

- **Governor Abbott issued a proclamation July 9 regarding expansion of hospital capacity by suspending elective surgeries in over 100 counties in Texas including Jefferson County. Prior to his proclamation, elective surgeries were banned in Bexar, Cameron, Dallas, Harris, Hidalgo, Nueces, Travis, and Webb counties.**
- **The next mobile testing site organized by the National Guard Mobile Testing Teams (MTT) will be July 19 at John Davis Community Center at 3580 East Lucas. Testing will be from 8am to 4pm or until they complete the number of tests the lab can support that day. No registration required.**
