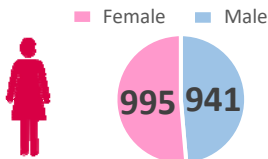
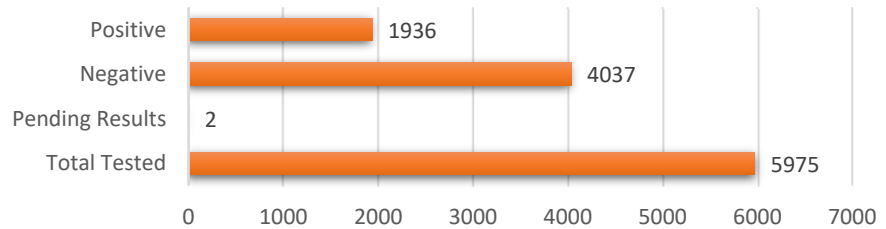

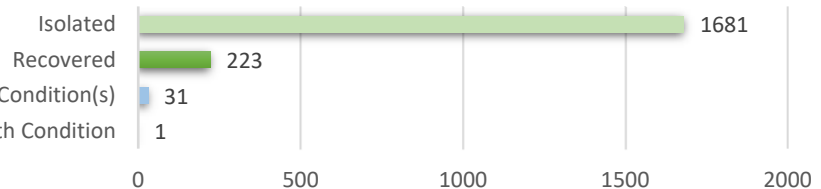

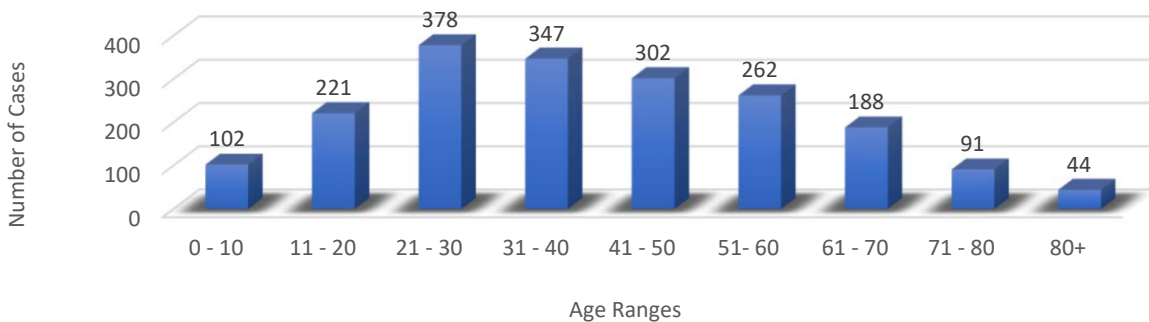
Status* of COVID-Test



Status of Confirmed Cases



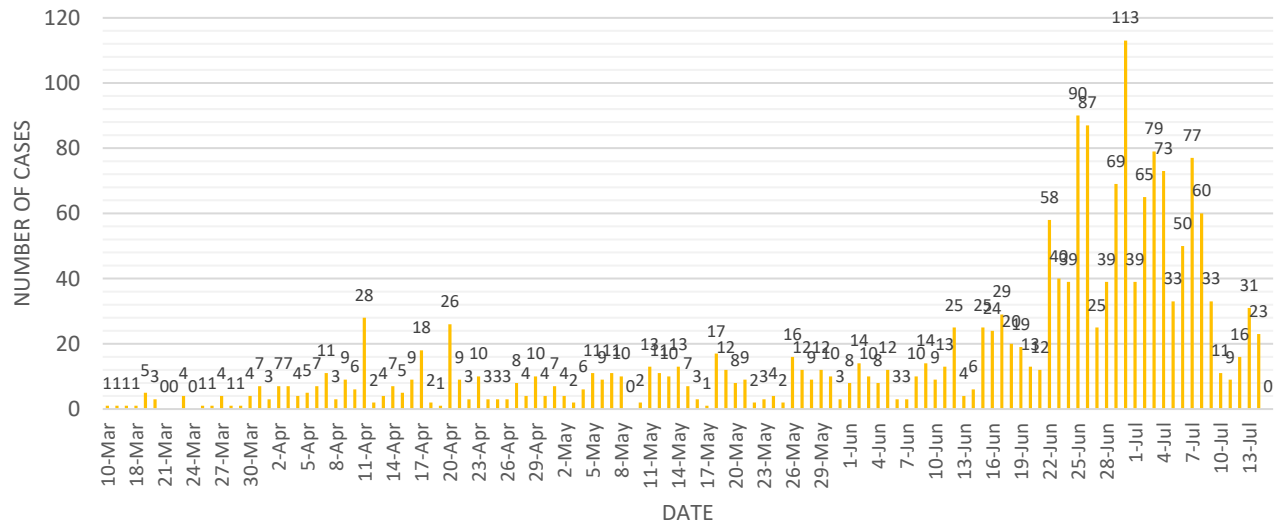
Confirmed Cases by Age Range

We will keep you updated if we receive additional support through the CARES Act or any additional COVID-19 relief legislation approved by Congress.
- The next mobile testing site organized by the National Guard Mobile Testing Teams (MTT) will be July 19 at John Davis Community Center at 3580 East Lucas. Testing will be from 8am to 4pm or until they complete the number of tests the lab can support that day. No registration required.
