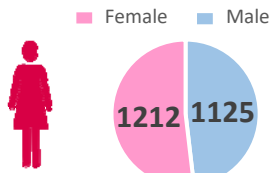
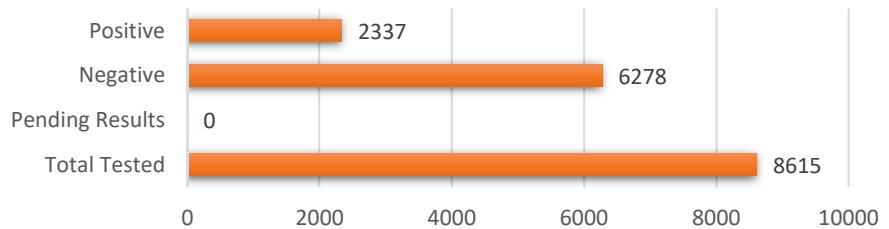

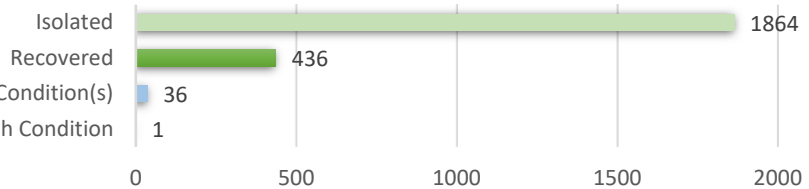

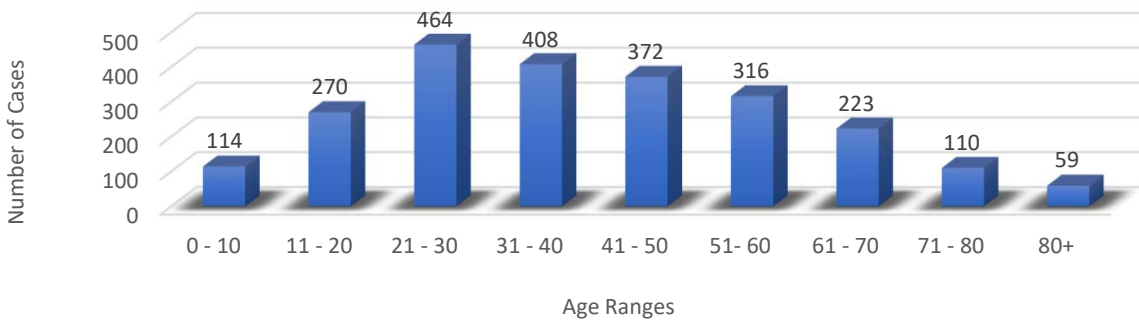

Status of Confirmed Cases



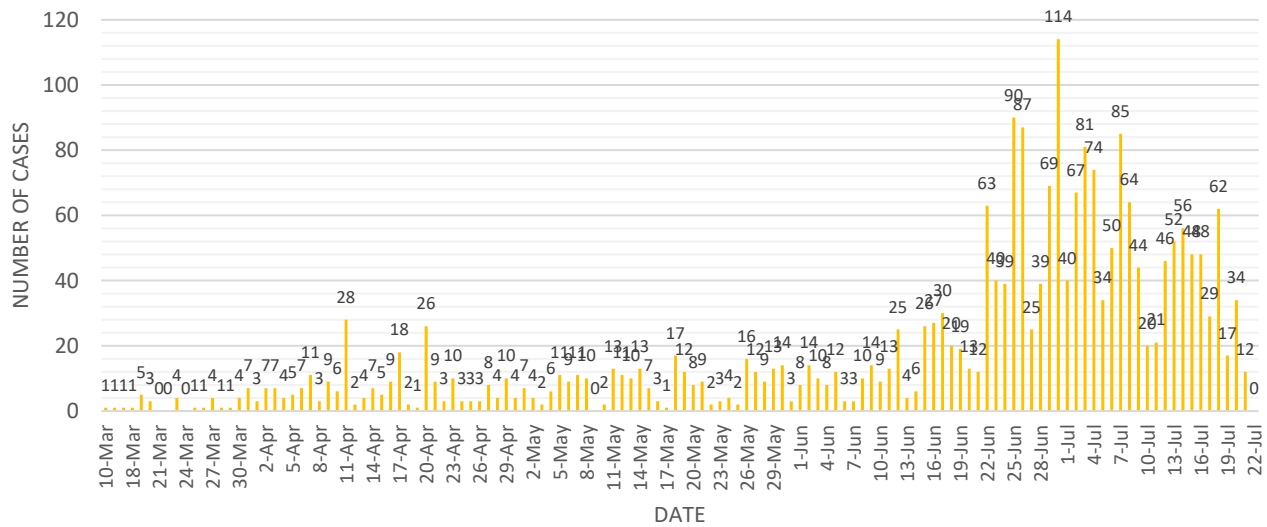
Confirmed Cases by Age Range
