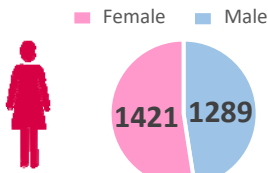
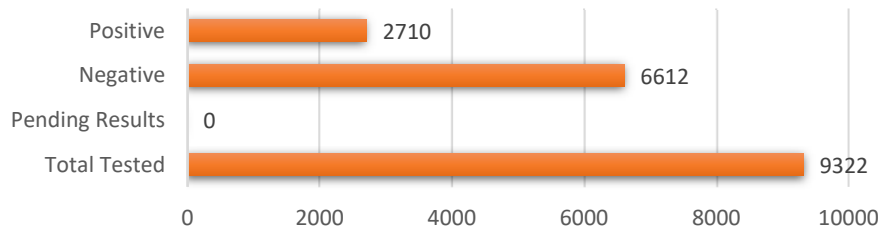

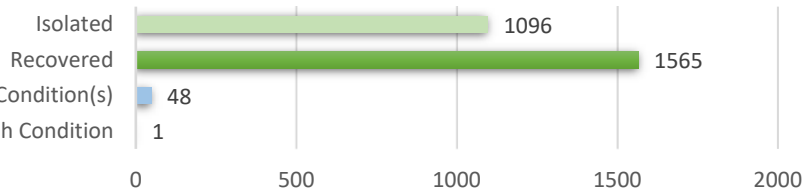
Status* of COVID-Test



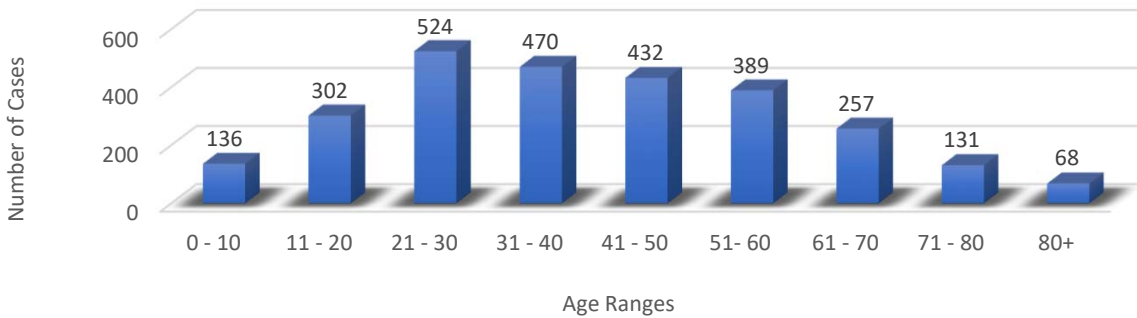
Deaths with Underlying Health Condition(s)

Status of Confirmed Cases



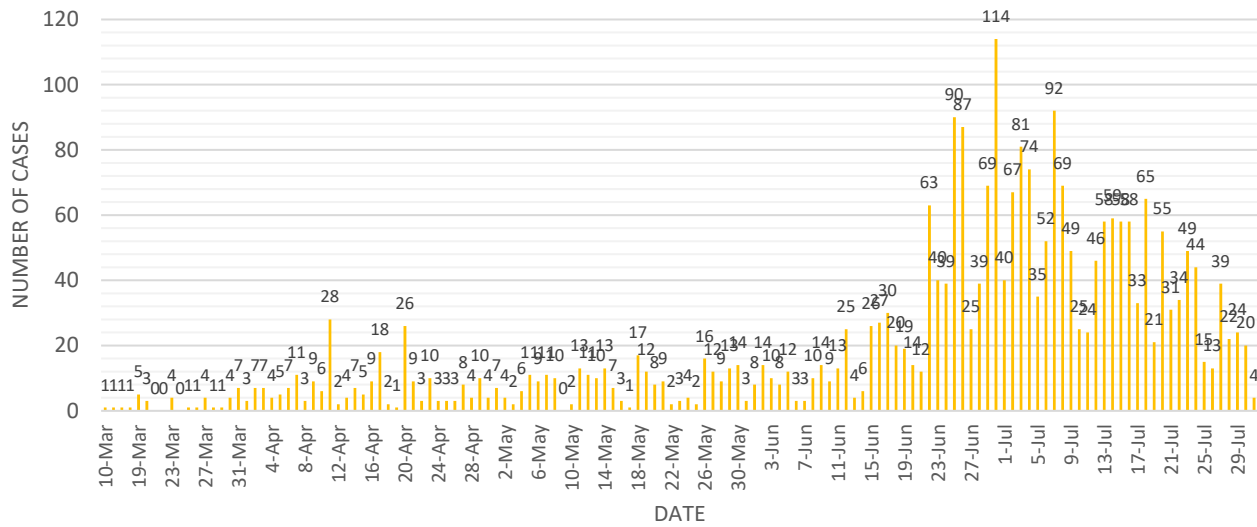
Confirmed Cases by Age Range

A message from Mayor Becky Ames, July 31, 2020:

- We are working towards organizing additional community Covid-19 Testing for the month of August. Please also refer to the list of private facilities that offer Covid-19 testing in Beaumont on the next page of this report.
- Recent changes to CDC guidelines no longer recommend 2 negative tests more than 24 hours apart for a person to be released from isolation/quarantine. CDC states that for most persons with COVID-19 illness, isolation and precautions can generally be discontinued 10 days after symptom onset and resolution of fever for at least 24 hours, without the use of fever-reducing medications, and with improvement of other symptoms. According to these guidelines the Beaumont Public Health Department will no longer require a person who has tested positive for COVID-19 to have 2 negative test results prior to being released from isolation/quarantine.
